Canadian Academy of Geriatric Psychiatry (CAGP) and it was a wonderful success! With over 200 participants the event was sold out! Many thanks to Sherri Helsdingen, Dr. Martha Donnelly and the TO Corp Staff for making the event so memorable!

Highlights of the CCSMH included keynote addresses from Dr. Marie-France Rivard and Dr. Gillian Mulvale on the future of geriatric mental health and the work of the Mental Health Commission of Canada.

Conference participants were treated to an afternoon of workshops focused the implementation of the CCSMH National Guidelines pilot projects.





Highlights included:

- * The first public viewing of the CSMH Suicide Prevention video
- * An educational module on depression assessment and treatment
- * Sharing of the CCSMH new tools for depression assessment and treatment and assessment of suicide risk.
- * Information on implementation in Long Term Care Homes.

As well, on September 23rd 2008 a report was released by the Canadian Institute for Health Information (CIHI) on what makes a communities mentally healthy. The CCSMH was commissioned to contribute to the report by writing a paper on communities that are mentally health for seniors.
