Updates from the Executive Director

2007 In Review

The CCSMH had another exciting year in 2007. With our 2nd National Conference: New Directions in Seniors' Mental Health, the ongoing dissemination of our National Guidelines for Seniors' Mental Health, the establishment of the Mental Health Commission of Canada, and a new grant from the Public Health Agency of Canada it was a busy year!!

What's Happening in 2008?

The first half of 2008 is dedicated to the completion of our Population Health Fund, Public Health Agency of Canada grant. This grant is focused on the ongoing dissemination of the CCSMH National Guidelines for Seniors' Mental Health as well as the implementation of the guidelines in a variety of settings and disciplines. Project highlights to date include:

- Hosting a Special Research Workshop on "Adapting the CCSMH Guideline on the Assessment and Treatment of Delirium to Palliative Care Settings"
- Creating user-friendly fold out tools to assist in the assessment of depression in older adults for family physicians.
- Working with a inter-professional team at Baycrest to implement recommendations from the Long-Term Care Homes guidelines
- A script development for an online video and a brochure used to help teach "suicide prevention in older adults"
- A special project in Ontario working with psychogeriatric resource consultants to create strategies for implementing the Long Term Care Home recommendations in Ontario Long Term Care Homes.

Stay tuned for more exciting updates from these projects in our next newsletter!
