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Chair's Report

Welcome to the Spring edition of our newsletter. We are excited to tell you about some of the things that we have been working on for these past few months!

Substance Use Disorder Project

Our main focus continues towards the development of clinical guidelines on substance use disorder (alcohol, benzodiazepines, cannabis and opioids) among older adults. Our working groups for this project have begun to draft preliminary recommendations for their guidelines. We are hosting workshops at conferences in April and May in order to hear feedback from stakeholders on the guidelines to date. We remain on time to finalize all four of the sets of guidelines this summer with publication in the late fall of this year. Once the content of the guidelines is finalized, we will begin the production of clinical pocket cards, brochures and other project material.

CAGP-CCSMH Annual Scientific Meeting

The Canadian Academy of Geriatric Psychiatry (CAGP) and the Canadian Coalition for Seniors' Mental Health (CCSMH) are pleased to be co-hosting a joint Annual Scientific Meeting (ASM) in Halifax, Nova Scotia from October 12 to 13, 2018. The theme of the meeting is 'Integrated Mental Health and Medical Care for Older Adults: Bringing Science and Practice Together.'

The ASM provides the opportunity to share, network and find renewed energy in our work of caring for older adults. This will be the first ASM hosted in Halifax since 2002 and the first joint ASM between the CCSMH and the CAGP since 2014. We intend for it to be a special, collaborative conference and we warmly welcome attendees from across disciplines and across the country.

Other Activities

In addition to this work, we remain engaged in several other efforts relating to the mental health of older adults in Canada.

Seclusion and Restraint

We were members of the Planning Committee for a Mental Health Commission of Canada meeting held in February on the subject of the use of seclusion and restraint in the mental health field in Canada. This meeting was attended by experts in the field including people with lived experience, nurses and other healthcare practitioners, academics and policy makers. At the close of the meeting, there was a unanimous sense of resolve that these practices can be reduced drastically, if not eliminated with the right resources in place. In cases where these practices are unavoidable, there are ways to manage and reduce any potential trauma felt by the person being restrained or put in seclusion.

Atlantic Seniors Mental Health Network (ASMHN)

We are looking forward to working on a collaborative effort with the Atlantic provinces on an initiative to support and build our Atlantic provincial network to be a strong multi-disciplinary voice to promote and support seniors' mental health providers in Eastern Canada. Known as the Atlantic Seniors Mental Health Network (ASMHN), it would be a regional network of the Canadian Coalition of Seniors Mental Health Health (CCSMH), Canada's leading organization in seniors' mental healthcare. It is envisioned to form a template for future regional network development initiates throughout Canada. Stay tuned for more details to follow.

The Age-Friendly Societies Forum

CCSMH and CAGP will be participating The Age-Friendly Societies Forum: "Towards a world adapted for older adults: Maintaining Quality of Life", scheduled for April 30 and May 1, 2018. This forum is hosted by the International Longevity Centre of Canada and the LIFE Research Institute Ottawa University. The forum will have four pillars: age-friendly health care, age-friendly homes, age-friendly retail and age-friendly travel. The goal is to identify data, research and policy gaps regarding the demographic aging boom.

Fountain of Health Initiative: Public Health Agency of Canada Webinar

A webinar was hosted on February 7, 2018 by the Public Health Agency of Canada in collaboration with CCSMH and the Fountain of Health (FoH). The webinar's focus was to promote the FoH Initiative for Optimal Aging, one of the first educational initiatives of its kind in the world. The webinar discussed the importance of raising awareness about the science of healthy aging, and practical steps to promote health over the life span. Invited participants included seniors, researchers, policy makers, community workers and practitioners, health care professionals and caregivers with an interest in seniors' mental health promotion.

Fountain of Health: Canadian Centre for Aging and Brain Health Innovation (CCABHI) Proposal

We also recently submitted a full stage 2 Researcher-Clinician Partnership Program grant application to the Canadian Centre for Aging and Brain Health Innovation (CCABHI) in collaboration with the Fountain of Health (FoH). If we receive this grant we will be able to study the feasibility, acceptability and effectiveness of a national scale-up of the FoH health behavior change tools and interventions. If we are successful at obtaining this grant, we will be calling on each one of you to be part of this project and we will certainly need "all hands on deck".
